



Grand County Stage 2 Fire Restriction Information



What does Stage 2 mean? The second stage of fire restrictions occurs when there is high to extremely high fire danger. Stage 2 intensifies the restrictions from Stage 1 by focusing on activities that have a relatively high risk of causing a fire to start. Stage 2 restriction will affect forest users, but the County has decided that the benefits of keeps our communities safe outweigh the economic and social impacts of going into Stage 2 Fire Restrictions. What is Allowed?

- Use of liquid or gas fueled stoves and appliances.
- Fires INSIDE the home of private residences.
- Fires used to inflate commercial hot air balloons.



Permitted fires by persons with a permit specifically authorizing the prohibited act, such as professional fireworks.

What is **NOT** Allowed?

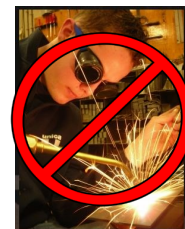
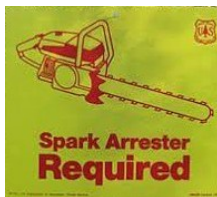
Building, maintain, or using an open fire of any kind, outside the home, whether on public OR private land.



Operating an internal or external combustion engine without an approved spark-arresting device properly installed and in working order.

Smoking outside

Welding or operating torches with open flame.



The use of incendiary devices in unincorporated Grand County (fused explosives, exploding ammunition, tracer ammunition, model rockets, or sky lanterns).

The possession, use and sale of permissible fireworks and fireworks in unincorporated Grand County.
