

Information and instructions on how to install your new 9-1-1 reflective address sign

- **Your \$30 sign kit will include the following:**
 - 6x18” predrilled, green reflective address sign made of .063 aluminum
 - 3” house numbers (vertical) and county road numbers (horizontal) easily seen day and night
- You will need to purchase one 8’ T-Post and two U-Bolts from your local hardware store to mount your sign (optional).
- The reverse side of your sign has only your house number. This is a standard in many Grand County communities and allows for viewing your address as drivers return back down your road from the opposite direction.
- **If you have purchased the \$20 - 4x12” house number sign**, you can request it to be made vertical or horizontal. These signs are predrilled with small holes and are meant to be mounted on a structure.



1. Recommended installation:



- a. Call 8-1-1 (call811.com) to have your utilities located before digging and installing your t-post.
- b. Pound the t-post into the ground approximately 18” at the end of your driveway, next to the street, preferably on the far side of your driveway as you approach your house. (See reverse for diagram)
- c. Make sure your t-post will not be in the path of the snowplow and will not get buried under the snow in the winter.
- d. Connect the sign to the t-post by inserting the u-bolts into the pre-drilled holes on either the left or the right side of the sign, depending on its placement on your property.
- e. Make sure your sign is visible from the road and not obscured by bushes or trees.

2. Optional installation

- a. Many homeowners have a location in mind for their sign, such as an existing fence post. This is acceptable as long as the sign is visible from the road.
- b. If your home is very close to the road, you may want to install the sign on your structure. This is acceptable as long as the sign is visible from the road.
